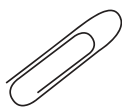

February Meeting Minutes

February 5, 2020 1:00 PM Regular Meeting

President Cheryl Troxel called the meeting to order.

Susie Lambeth brought the invocation with a prayer, "Yesterday, Today and Tomorrow".

Ernestine Shugart led the Pledges of Allegiance to the Flags of the United States and Texas.

President Troxel thanked the hostesses: Chair Joyce Garrison, Patsy Newsom, Kathy Preissinger, Shirley Capps, Donna Roessler, Kay Crain and Carolyn McLeod.

President Troxel asked members to introduce their guests.

Carolyn Riley presented Lula Pope Tidwell; *Nancy Priddy* presented Linda Frost and Ellen Tennison; *Patsy Hurd* presented Jan Caldwell Hullet; *Cathey Briscoe* presented Michelle Davis; and *Melinda Charbonnet* presented Linda Bush and Donna Campbell.

Marian Winslow introduced the speaker, Diann Lewis, an Active Member of WWC, who is the manager of Kroger. Diann spoke on the topic, "Family and Consumer Science". Kroger was founded by Bernard Kroger in 1883. Today there are 2,758 stores in 35 states and the District of Columbia. Kroger has clothing, jewelry and shoe departments, pharmacies, medical clinics, food processing and manufacturing facilities and employs over 453,000 people. In Granbury, Kroger has met the needs of its shoppers with nutrient department, pharmacy that will offer call list for renewals while cooperating with doctors, and a quick list of past purchases to help reduce impulse buying. The store offers weekly ads, digital coupons, magazines with recipes, Simple Truth Organic products and curb side pick up for call in delivery. Several members complimented Diann and Kroger for their involvement with the community programs such as United Way, Salvation Army and hiring mentally challenged personnel. She shared with the club, "My day begins with a smile and hug from these employees."

Business Meeting:

Melinda Charbonnet explained the information sheet that was being distributed for approval and/or corrections for the directory and photographs will be taken again in March.

Cheryl Troxel announced the offices for 2020-2021 WWC individually and asked for nominations from the members as she read the positions and the individual name presented by the nominating board. Since no floor nominations were presented, the slate of officers was accepted unanimously.

Recording Secretary Pat Flatt reported 37 Active Members, one Associate Member, one Honorary Lifetime Member and seven guests for a total of 46 present. January minutes were filed as presented.

Nancy Priddy discussed the March 18, 2020, Field Trip to the Ft. Worth Woman's Club. Transportation is available for \$5.00 each way and the lunch price is \$10.00. Members should meet at the clubhouse at 11:00 am, arrive at the Ft. Worth Club by noon and depart at 2:00 pm. A private tour of the facility is scheduled. She reminded members to bring money to the March meeting.

Cheryl Troxel reported that several members and family members had health issues and were unable to attend. Members in attendance acknowledged health concerns of their husbands also.

She announced that our club had been asked to donate to a fund for the outgoing Texas Federation of Women's Clubs Carol Habgood. Funds are used to enhance the outgoing state president's pin as explained by Carolyn McLeod.

Chair of the Clubhouse, Linda Somervill, said that the new roof was completed with ridge vents, class 4 shingles (which could reduce the insurance premiums at renewal), and the committee is making a list of needs for the new officers.

Betty Curl thanked the members for their donations to the Rainbow Room.

The Federated Report was printed in the February issue of the WWC Newsletter.

Chloe Steinhagen reported that the Salvation Army Women's Service League would be hosting a garage sale in Johnson County on April 24-25 and any donated items would be collected. She said to contact her on her mobile phone number.

Recipe: Seasoned Pretzels

- 1 (16 oz) bag of Rold Gold Tiny Twist pretzels
- To a large bowl of pretzels add:
- 2 tbsp. dill weed
 - 1 tsp garlic powder
 - 1/2 tsp. onion powder
 - 1 pkg. Hidden Valley Ranch Dressing Mix
 - 1/2 bottle Orville Redenbacher's Popping & Topping Oil

Stir up from bottom of bowl every 10-15 minutes to coat pretzels. Keep turning pretzels over 3 hours or so until popcorn oil is absorbed. Store in air-tight container. May be frozen.
